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
Something my father (artist Jeff Raglus) instilled in me is the magic of getting the balance right between two or three colours. I now find these harmonies exist all around me – the dusty salmon pink and an off-white roof on a vintage Holden FB is perfection. I can't separate the relationship between art and life, because I base my art on my life.

My compositions and lines speak to the coastal landscape which I call home. As I watch the horizon from the top of a surfboard, I can't help but notice the repetitious geometries in my environment. Watching sets roll in translates into multiple lines across my compositions.

Being a surfer has also instilled a special level of patience in me. Monitoring the ocean for the right surf conditions makes you patient whether you like it or not. I practise this skill in making my paintings – creating hard-edge shapes, maintaining straight lines and layering oils over and over waiting for things to dry. This whole process takes me weeks, it takes restraint and composure. There's a sense of calmness that comes when I apply this type of focus to my artwork. In life, there are so many chaotic unknowns and unpredictable things that come up but the ability for me to control the process of painting gives me a sense of security. My practice in minimalism is balanced by a sense of meditative calmness and childlike excitement. The surprise of mixing oil paints to create that perfect hue still gets me.

In this body of work, I leant into bright fun colours. I wanted to allow myself to have a new 'favourite colour' each week, as I did as a youth. I hope that these paintings give the viewer the space to find a way through whatever they are going through in their own life.


Making these works certainly allowed me to do that as I dealt with two major moments in my own life – finding out that my grandmother had passed and that my wife was pregnant with our first baby. The bittersweet timing of this news was not something I could control. I had to adjust and be open to these inevitable changes in life. Through making this body of work I had allowed myself to experience the emotions and give myself a moment to *Unfold*.


Sundown


Detour


Wandering


Whole Life


Returning


Greeting


Vital Kiss


