
The Song of Increase

The Song of Increase is the name given to the humming sound a colony of bees makes when they are at the most joyful peak. Over the past year, Amanda Schunker has found herself referencing this phenomenon as she navigates her life without her sister. As a method for healing, she began returning to the landscape to sit, paint and meditate. Schunker began this body of work from this place, painting en plein air. In a way, the cliffside location she painted from was chosen for her – whilst on one of her outdoor expeditions, she rediscovered an area where she had once visited with her sister. In this space, she found comfort in its natural beauty and the joyful memories grounded in its place.


In her paintings, Amanda has captured these qualities in the hope of transcending the viewer to another realm, where they enter a place of their internal landscape. Of this, she says: "I find myself traversing the landscape time and time again, finding solace within the magnitude of rock formations. These ancient, non-denominational forms dwarf any reticence. I paint en plein air, melding the nuances and intricacies before me, with a sense of immediacy and uninhibited responses. In the studio, colour becomes a catalyst to induce an increased emotive state. The collision of mark-making, adding and subtracting, triggers memory; a new porthole evolves."


Expanding Sphere of Presence Between Us, 2024






Her Emotion to Space is Carried to All of Us, 2024 Acrylic on canvas 123 x 163 cm Framed in American ash \$ 6,800




Earth's Web, 2024


Cartography of Flight Lines, 2024 Acrylic on canvas 33 x 54 cm Framed in American ash \$ 1,900
